Eisenhower Turns From Indian Tribes To Southern Leaders

By the Associated Press DENVER, Aug. 11.—Happy over a friendly pow-wow with 35 American Indian tribes, Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower changes pace today to confer with G.O.P. farm leaders and a delegation of Dixie supporters.

The Republican presidential candidate flew back here last night from Gallup, N. Mex., where he said he spent one of the most enjoyable days in weeks as a guest of honor at the 31st annual intertribal Indian ceremonial.

"I thoroughly enjoy that kind of a show," the general told reporters-with a trace of a wistful thought about booking additional relaxing appearances.

But today it was back to more serious business. He arranged to sit down first (1 p.m., EST) with a group of backers from eight Southern States—some of them representatives from the regular Republican organizations, others from Citizens - for - Eisenhowen clubs in the South.

After that session, the general was scheduled to meet with a group of Republican members of the Senate and House Agriculture Committees, and other party farm leaders.

Draw Wider Benefits.

Over the week end, Gen. Eisen hower called for expansion of the social security program to cover an additional 14 million persons, and for increased old age assistance grants.


After conferring with three Re-publican members of the House Ways and Means Committee, Gen. Eisenhower issued a statement Saturday saying:

"I am particularly concerned about the present inadequacies of the social security law and feel strongly that the law ought to be extended to presently uncovered persons.

The general also said that, as President, he would press for en-actment of legislation which would "lighten the burden of the high cost of living on our senior citizens."

Stevenson to Direct His Own Campaign, **Chief Aide Insists**

By the Associated Pres SPRINGFIELD, Ill., Aug. 11.-Gov. Adlai Stevenson's top lieu-tenant said flatly yesterday the Democratic presidential nominee will boss his own campaign and indicated the Democratic Na-tional Committee will play a secondary role in directing . the fight.

Wilson Wyatt, Gov. Stevenson's personal campaign manager, told reporters "the campaign is under the direction of the Governor-and there is only one general." Mr. Wyatt's statement came after Frank E. McKinney, retiring Democratic National Chairman, had said: "There can be only one general, and he is the chairman of the Democratic National Committee.'

McKinney Steps Aside. This sharp difference of opinion over who will be the "general" in the campaign cropped out at a news conference attended by Mr. McKinney, Mr. Wyatt, and Chicago lawyer Stephen A. Mitchell, who succeeds Mr. McKinney as National Chairman.

For all practical purposes, Mr. McKinney stepped aside yesterday as national chairman and turned whose election by the National Committee is a mere formality. Mr. McKinney said he would return to Washington, clean up his




